





Montana Area Comparison





Montana County Population Population Density 2010








Center of Population: 1880 to 2010












Percent American Indian by County

Percent American Indian in Montana by Census Tract: Census 2010








Percent Hispanic in Montana by Census Tract: Census 2010















Percent of Population 21 Years and Over with a Disability










HIV Cases Diagnosed in Montana by County of Residence 1985 to 2010

Among the newly diagnosed cases, 70% reported residing in one of the 7 most populated Montana counties (Cascade, Flathead, Gallatin, Lewis & Clark, Missoula, Ravalli, Yellowstone) at the time of diagnosis." Persons Living with HIV Infection in Montana




