STONEWALL HALL



Stonewall Hall, the original territorial capitol building for Montana, is in imminent danger of collapse.



Built in Virginia City in 1864, it was home to Montana's territorial legislature from 1865 1875.



Recently, the owner agreed to transfer the building to the State, creating the best

preservation opportunity in decades.

Home to influential Montana pioneer and territorial legislator.




GILBERT RESIDENCE Home to local businessman and brewery owner.
