Bio and Life Sciences

- A world-class, state-of-the-art biomedical research facility with scientists from around the world is located in the rural community of Hamilton.

Optics and Photonics

- Bozeman has one of the highest densities of optics/photonics companies in the United States on a per-capita basis.

Advanced Manufacturing | Semiconductors

- A small Montana city has manufacturing expertise to build semiconductor equipment for a Fortune 500 company headquartered in Silicon Valley.

Autonomous and Sensor Technology

- Out of more than 300 applications nationally, Montana was one of only 12 locations approved to be a “tech-hub” as part of the CHIPS and Science Act.
